Born at Little Rock, Arkansas U.S.A. July 4th, 1884.

Graduate in Medicine-M.D. at University of Arkansas
1909.

Went to China Feb. 1914 as a Medical Missionary of
the Episcopal Church, -WUCHANG,
Province of Hupei, also Port
Physician at KIUKIANG, Kiangshi,
China from 1922 thru 1927-June,
when I returned to the USA.

Joined the U.S. Navy Reserves as Medical Officer-
Lt(jg). 1921 at HANKOW, Hupei, China.
Promoted to Lt. USNR. 1924.

State Public Health Work in the USA. from July 1927
to July 1936.

Accepted a position with the Civilian Conservation
Corps with the Army to do special
work with Malarial Prophylaxis
Atabrine & Plasmochin. This was very
widely used in the Far East during
this last War.

August 1940 was called to The Colors-U.S. Navy and
was stationed at Key West, Fla. USA.
Ordered to The Far East August 1941.

Sailed from San Francisco, Calif on
17th, November 1941-The first ship
to sail for the Far East after
the Japanese Attack. Landed at
Soerabia, Java Jan. 27th, 1942.
Sailed out of Java on the last Ship
to leave Java on March 3, 1942 with
the last ten of the wounded of the
U.S.S. Marblehead and Houston, from
Tjilatjap, Java.

Landed at Fremantle-West Australia
March 13th, 1942. Flew back to the
USA. May 1 1942.

Assisted in making the picture "The Story of Dr. Wassell"
as produced by Paramount Pictures Inc.
The profits of this picture-5% of
the gross receipts was turned over
to Navy Relief. You know the Java
scenes were shot in Mexico. You see

all of the profits of this picture went
to the Navy Relief-no private profits.

During my odd times when not at attendance at the
Paramount Picture Inc. I made talks in
War Plants. to encourage more and better
work among the workmen and women. In
all I made over one thousands appearances
and as many talks over the whole of
the U.S.A.
