GODBOLE, SHANKAR NAGNATH, Chemist; born January 29, 1886, Poona City, India; son of Nagnath Keshao Godbole and Sundrabai Soni; educated at Bombay University, B.Sc, 1909, first in order of merit; Allahabad University M.Sc. 1912; Married Krishnabai Jog, 1908; 6 sons and 4 daughters; was awarded Balwantrao Mahajan Prize, 1911; Morris Memorial Research Fellow 1912-13; worked on Composition of Indian Garnet, published by the Geographical Survey of India; also worked on Bonducellanut oil; was appointed Asst. Professor of Chemistry, 1913; Principal, College of Science, Nagpur, 1937-38; Head, Chemistry Department, Nagpur University, 1929-45; Dean, Faculty of Science, 1939-42; Member, Executive Council, Nagpur University, 1929-46; Honorary Registrar, Nagpur University, for some time; Honorary Treasurer, Nagpur University, 1944-46; Chemical Examiner of Explosives to the Government of Central Provinces & Berar, 1928-40. Titles of Rao Saheb and Rao Bahadur conferred by Government of India in 1929 and 1945 respectively; awarded Silver Jubilee and Coronation Medals. One of the founders of Indian Gymkhana Nagpur; Chairman, Board of Directors, Natwar Transpost Co., Ltd., Nagpur; Chairman, Central Hindusthan Industrial Corporation Ltd., Nagpur; Director, Central Hindusthan Orange & Cold Storage Co., Ltd., Nagpur; Interested in the manufacture of Paints, Varnishes and Tanning.
