Professor in the history of art at the same university 1927-1948.

Member of the Academy of Finland since 1948.

Art critic of one of the leading daily papers of Finland 1924-1945.

Member in the trustees of several cultural foundations and societies.

Journeys to nearly all countries of Europe for purposes of study. Several longer visits to Italy.

The main interests of research: The Renaissance art in Italy, and the history of Finnish art.

A great number of publications, mainly on Italian art and Finnish art, a series of comprehensive handbooks of the history of art (The Antique Greek and Roman Art, The Mediaeval Art, the Art of Renaissance), several artist-monographies, etc. The latest work published at Christmas 1949: the biography of the Finnish painter A.
