Albert Pražák was born on the 11th of June 1880 in Chroustovice /Czechoslovakia/. He studied at the Grammarschool in Hradec Králové, ^{and} at the Charles University in Prague. /The literature of the world and especially the Czechoslovak and other Slav literatures./ He took ^{and} his degree /Ph.D./ in 1906 ~~and~~ (his examinations as Professor of Grammar - schools ⁱⁿ 1905) 1906-1914 he was teaching at Grammar-schools, in Prague. 1914-18 he served as an officer in the Austrian Army. ^{/captain/} 1921-32 he was professor of Czech and Slovak literature ~~in~~ at the University in Bratislava. In 1933 he became professor of the History of Czech literature at the Charles University in Prague. 1945 he was President of the National Council in the May Revolution. He is a member of the Academy of Sciences and Arts in Prague, of the Royal Society of Science in Prague, the Founder and member of the Šafaříkova Society in Bratislava, ~~and~~ Founder and Member of the ^{(Society of for} Literary history, member of the Syndicate of Bohemian Writers, Member of the National Council of Research, Member of the Institute for Czech Literature, President of the Slavonic Institute. 1911-14-~~and~~ Editor of ^{the periodicals} Masaryk's "Čas" /1911-14/, of "Naše věda" /Our Science/ 1920-38/, of "Bratislava" 1926-34/, of "Vysokoškolské rukověti" /Text-Books for Universities/ 1939-50, of "Slovesná věda" /Science of Literature/ 1948-50, of ~~XXXXXXXX~~ "Národní bibliotéka" /National Library/ 1948-50, of ^{the} Complete Edition of Vrchlický's Poems 1947-50.
