Dear DuSolier:

Last week I sent you a copy of statements regarding the Buena Vista connection into the Caddoan area that I had prepared and which were extensively revised by Krieger. For this reason, it seemed advisable to include his name on the title page along with mine. I trust that this action will meet with your approval and that you think the statement is adequate. I have about had your report translated.

Have you revised your report, and are the plates and charts ready for you to send up for me to transmit the paper to American Antiquity? MacNeish's preliminary report on his survey is also about ready, and I believe we can have both papers published in the same number of American Antiquity.

American Antiquity makes a charge for additional plates over, I believe, a limit of one. Since my name will be included as a co-author, so to speak, it will be possible for me to have our Museum pay for the additional plates from our Museum funds.

Both MacNeish and I would be very pleased if you would care to keep in touch with us from time to time with regard to your continued investigations of the connections between the Huaxtec area and the Southeast.

At Norman you asked if I would care for a photostatic copy of the wall painting at Tamuin. We would, indeed, be very grateful if you would be able to send this copy to us.

You will be interested to know that MacNeish's sherds have arrived.
