

Didrik Arup Seip, born aug. 31. 1884; educated at University of Oslo. Studies at the Universities of Copenhagen, Uppsala, Berlin. Ph. D. Oslo 1916. Professor of Scandinavian Languages, Oslo ~~Univ.~~ Univ. since 1916. Dean of Art Faculty 1927-32. President of Univ. of Oslo 1937-45.

During the German occupation of Norway he was imprisoned, first in Grini concentration camp near Oslo seven months, then in Sachsenhausen concentration camp and later in jail in Berlin for nine months, later living in Germany until release in 1945. President of the Institute for Comparative Research in Human Culture, Oslo since 1945. Hon. Ph. D. Univ. of Hamburg 1938; Univ. of Copenhagen 1945; Sorbonne Paris 1945; Univ. of Reykjavik 1946. Member Acad. of Arts and Sciences: Oslo, Trondheim, Lund (Sweden), Gothenburg, Stockholm, Copenhagen. Knight (Grand Cross) Norwegian St. Olav Order 1945. Awarded Peace Medal Swedish Red Cross 1945. Married Johanne Remmer ~~JKK~~ July 1, 1914.

He has published many linguistic works, specially on the history of the Norwegian language: Norsk språkhistorie til omkring 1370 (1931); Studier i norsk språkhistorie (1934). In "Hjemme og i fiendeland" (1946) he has published his memories of the German occupation in Norway and of his experience met with the deportation to Germany. He is editor of Works by Henrik Ibsen and Henrik Wergeland.
