Reflection question

From your point of view, what do you see as the biggest challenge facing open education according to UNESCO's recommendations?



(i) Capacity building of stakeholders on creation, access, re-use, adaptation and redistribution

- raising awareness of how OER can expand access
- provide systematic and continuous training of OER
- raise awareness of copyright for education and research
- leverage open tools/platforms and standards
- make available easily accessible OER resources
- promote digital literacy skills



(ii) Developing supportive policies

- develop and implement policies that support open licensing of OER
- encouraging and supporting institutions to develop policy frameworks
- develop mechanisms to build communities of practice, networks of expertise and recognition
- address the inclusion of OER in education and equity transformation
- encouraging and supporting OER research through research programmes
- develop and implement policies that implement identity and data protection standards



(iii) Promoting effective, inclusive and equitable access

- ensuring access for learners' needs and programmes
- support gender, cultural, linguistic, linguistic and language-sensitive production
- ensure the principles of gender equality, non-discrimination and inclusion
- ensure investment in ICT infrastructure and broadband
- encourage open education development and research
- develop standards, benchmarks and criteria for OER quality assurance



(iv) Promoting the creation of sustainability models

- review provisions, procurement policies and regulations to expand and simplify
- catalysing traditional and non-traditional sustainability models (donations, incentives)
- promote other value-added models, with collective value generation, partnerships and innovation
- enacting regulatory frameworks that support the development of OER and services
- promote the faithful linguistic translation of open licences, to ensure their proper implementation
- providing mechanisms for the implementation, enforcement and improvement of OER
- optimising education and research funds and budgets through collaboration



(v) Promoting and strengthening international cooperation

- promote and stimulate cross-border collaboration and partnerships on projects
- establish regional and international funding mechanisms for OER
- supporting the creation and maintenance of effective peer networks sharing OER
- incorporating OER clauses in international education agreements
- developing a framework for copyright for educational and research purposes
- supporting the contribution of cross-cultural communication, group management







Figure 1: The three proposed key constructs for scaling complex thinking for everyone: Open Science, Open Innovation, and 4.0 Education.






