PROFESSOR HUGO THEORELL

Born July 6, 1903, in Linköping, Sweden.

Parents: Ture Theorell, physician, and Armida Theorell, née Bill.
Married to Margit Alenius 1931, three sons born 1935, 1939 and 1942.

Studied for a medical degree at the Caroline Institute, Stockholm.
Doctor of Medicine 1930, lecturer physiological chemistry at the
Caroline Institute 1930-32, assistant professor of medical chemist-
ry at the University of Uppsala 1932-36. Worked with Professor
Otto Warburg, Kaiser Wilhelm Institut. für Zellphysiologie,
Berlin-Dahlem, Oct. 1933-January 1935. Professor and director of
the Medical Nobel Institute, Biochemical Department, since 1937.

Lectured in many European countries and in the United States and
Canada. Member of a commission sent by the World Health Organiza-
tion to Israel and Iran 1951.

Member of the Swedish Academy of Sciences and the Swedish Academy
of Engineering Sciences. Member of the Finnish ^{and the Norwegian} Medical Society
of The Royal Danish Academy of Science and Letters and of the
Norwegian Academy of Science. Member of Schweiz. Chem. Gesellschaft;
Société de Chimie Biologique, Paris; The Faraday Society and of
l'Accademia Nazionale del XL, Rome. Hon. member of Societa Chimica
Italiana and of American Academy of Arts and Sciences, Boston.

Doctor h.c. at the University of Sorbonne.

The Pasteur Medal of the Société de Chimie Biologique and different
medals and awards from Swedish scientific societies.

Awarded the Nobel Prize in Physiology and Medicin 1955.
