

AALTONEN, WÄINÖ VALDEMAR; Finnish sculptor and painter using in his sculpture mainly granite, marble and bronze, also majolica as his material; b.-94 at ~~Haminainen~~, Karinainen (near Turku); parents: Matti and Ida Katarina Aaltonen (Värri); attended the School of the Society of Artists in Turku (1910-15), studied in Italy -23, France and England -25, the Scandinavian countries -26 and -29, Russia, Switzerland, etc.; mem. Finnish Academy, Kalevala Society, Society of Finnish Artists, Assn. of Finnish Sculptors, Finnish Academy of Arts, Légion d'Honneur (France -28), Swedish Royal Academy of Arts, Salon Tuileries, Honorary Member of the Society of Artists in Turku and the Alekis Kivi Society, Honorary Ph.D. at the University of Lund (Sweden), Professor -40.

Exhibitions in Helsinki, Stockholm, Oslo, Berlin, Düsseldorf, Hamburg, Milan, Rome, Gothenburg, Paris, Eskilstuna, Malmö, etc.; gold medal at Vienna Exhibition -36, Grand Prix at Paris World Fair -40; works exhibited also at World Fairs in New York and San Francisco -59.
