They were really the ones I went to hear, but they were put off too late. ~~I hope~~ I hope the Caddoan culture, and the area were defined much more specifically Saturday afternoon and evening, and that there will be a report on the meeting which will soon be available.

As you know my interest in Mexico is very considerable and very real; and it is my hope sometime before I am too old to do any work there to get down in your country. I have not forgotten your offer to take me out hunting, and if I do get down will want to go out with you. I am still hopeful that you, or someone else, can go into Sonora to do some work with me sometime.
